My second point is regarding the hole inserts, please try to refrain from removing your ball from the hole by using your putter or the flag pole, this can raise the insert and effect the following players putts.

I've played at four different courses over the last month, all of which are considerably more expensive than Oundle, but none of them had greens in as good condition as ours. Let's try to help to keep it that way.
